History

- The **National Residence Hall Honorary** was created on April 25, 1964 at The University of Denver during the annual NACURH Conference.
- The blue symbolizes **loyalty** to purpose and idea, and the white symbolizes the **blank page** on which students write the experiences residence hall life brings.
- The diamond symbolizes the **value and beauty** of residence hall life, while the three links symbolize leaders that are **caring**, have **dedication**, and embody **participation**.
- The **Texas Longhorns Chapter** was founded in the Fall of 2002.
- In 2015, the chapter was renamed the **Dr. Floyd B. Hoelting Chapter** of NRHH following the retirement of the Executive Director of the Division of Housing and Food Service.

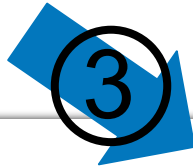

OTM Categories

- **Advisor:** an advisor of any hall government organization or program (Hall Coordinators, URHA/RHC advisor, etc)
- **Community:** any wing, floor, group of people, or even res. hall (2nd Floor Duren, the BRP staff, Jester West, the Quad, etc)
- **Student:** any resident/student who lives in the UT res. halls
 - First year students have their own category
- **Organization:** any group that benefits the residence halls (NRHH, RHC, URHA, RAA, etc)
- **Custodial/Maintenance:** anyone from building services, the lock shop, 2nd shift, or one of the maintenance shops
- **Spotlight:** miscellaneous section (food service employees, admins, etc; it's all-inclusive)
- **Program:** any program that a resident, student staff member, or organization organizes or sponsors
 - There are four types: community service, diversity, educational, and social

OTM Tips

□ Be specific for that month

- Who or what you nominate may be overall amazing, but make sure to include specific contributions for the current month

□ Assume nothing

- Write out acronyms, your audience likely doesn't know what they mean

□ Give lots of details

- OTMs don't have to reach word limits, but ones that get close are usually more detailed

□ Give examples

- Precisely show leadership traits and what makes the nominee stand out or be unique
